Dear [CEO]:

The American Hospital Association (AHA), Federation of American Hospitals (FAH), and American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) are fielding a survey to all member hospitals and health systems to collect quantitative, representative data on pharmaceutical spending and the impact of drug shortages. This information is critical to our efforts to educate policymakers and the public about the challenge of high and rising drug prices, and achieve sustainable drug pricing.

We have heard you: increasing and unpredictable spending on drugs and ongoing drug shortages are having an immense impact on hospitals and health systems. Our members report challenges accessing the drugs they need to care for patients and having to make tradeoffs to manage their operating budgets in light of dramatically higher drug costs.

In response to these concerns, the AHA, FAH, and ASHP are advocating for solutions with Congress and the Administration. To support these efforts, we need specific data to quantify the impact that challenges related to prescription drugs are having on your hospital. This data collection will update the <u>AHA/FAH drug study</u> released in 2016 that looked solely at inpatient drug spending, and also incorporate emerging issues related to outpatient drug spending and drug shortages. **Only aggregated results may be shared with policymakers and the media. Individual hospital data will not be shared.**
